Fireworks stands will be popping up soon, and this is just a reminder that no fireworks are allowed on HRS property at any time by anyone. Three years ago, a fire on HRS property started from

fireworks. This resulted in three homes burned, residents displaced and belongings lost.

In the past year alone, HRS has had fires in four locations. **(PHOTO:** Above, An HRS home on Coffelt St. in Cookeville damaged by smoke and fire in 2013.) Of the four fires this past year, two started from cigarettes, one from a lighter and one from food left cooking unattended.
